NC Early Education Coalition Quick Joint Conference Budget Review

Overall, the original Senate budget proposal prevailed on every budget item for Smart Start, NC Pre-K and Child Care Subsidies although the House and Senate budgets were very close in spending targets on these items as well.

- Smart Start receives an overall \$2.4 million in non-recurring funds with the exception of \$392,653 recurring federal funding for child care subsidies.
- NC Pre-K receives a \$1.7 million in recurring state funds for a 2% rate increase in FY 2019-20 and \$3.5 million recurring state funds for a 4% total rate increase in FY 2020-21. Rate increases are intended to be used to support early education teacher salaries in private child care programs.
- Child Care Subsidy assistance received a total of \$3.2 million increase in both FY 2019-20 and FYY 20-21, which will possibly allow the state to serve an additional 500 children. A special provision reduces the parent co-pay fee from 10% to 9%.

The final budget continued the trend of replacing state dollars with federal TANF funds which decreases the overall amount of new CCDBG funding available for child care subsidies and increases the reliance on federal funding for the NC Pre-K program.

- The total net amount of state funding for all DCDEE programs is decreased by \$3.2 million in FY 19-20 and \$12.4 million in FY 2020-21.
- NC Pre-K state funding was decreased by \$4.1 million in FY2019-20 and by \$6. 1 million in FY 2020-21 and replaced with federal TANF funding, which reduces state funding to just 17% in FY 2021 and 21% in FY 2020-19.
- Child care subsidy assistance state funding was reduced by \$5.4 million in FY 2019-20 and by \$12.6 million in FY 2020-21.

In other areas – the Joint Conference Budget included \$2.5 million in non-recurring funding to support items that were not included in either the House or Senate previous budgets.

- Alleghany Partnership for Children: \$40,000 in non-recurring funding for FY 2019-20 only to create a supervised visitation site and transportation for families to fulfill their child visiting goals.
- Transylvania County Early Childhood Education Initiative: \$25,000 in non-recurring funding for a direct Smart Start grant.
- Alliance for Children: \$10,000 in non-recurring funding for a direct Smart Start grant.
- Blue Ridge Partnership for Children: \$10,000 in non-recurring funding to support mobile prekindergarten classroom.
- Child Care Services Association: \$2 million in non-recurring funding to support prekindergarten services in Durham County.
