

NC Current Status of Child Care Programs

As of April 6, 2020 – based on applications submitted

- 2,608 centers (58% of all centers)
- 1,236 family child care homes (90% of all family child care homes)
- Programs can continue to submit applications to stay open and reopen.
- Application on the DCDEE website
- Must meet required health and safety guidelines.

Child Care Dilemma

"I'm having a really hard time deciding whether to stay open or not.

My staff are scared but I feel I have a duty to our parents."

"We have been open and serving our community for 23 years.

We have so many parents out of work. I am so afraid we will not survive and have to shut our doors forever. I do not want to lose my staff, most have been with us 10 to 15 years."



In North Carolina – April 3rd Update

DHHS/DCDEE COVID-10 Child Care Payment Policies

For the months of April and May –

- **Subsidy:** paid to all subsidized child care providers for March, April, and May service months, whether program is opened or closed. Payments consistent with March payment for Feb. services.
- Copayments: DCDEE covering the cost of all parent copays for April and May. Programs cannot collect fees from parents.
- Payment schedule: modified schedule now every two weeks
- **Recertifications:** Recertifications during in March, April and May will be extended for 12 months.

Child Care for Essential Workers

- **Emergency Hot Line** 888-600-1685 for essential workers to connect with available child care
- New Parents Complete Parent Application for Emergency Child Care Assistance
 - Parent provide application to the child care programs
- Parents must be:
 - Part of the essential workforce
 - Gross income below 300% FPL
 - Have no other child care option
- Parent Application Required
- Payments to child care programs based on actual attendance
- New rate structure see April 3 guidance



Bonuses for Child Care Teachers and Staff

DCDEE Bonuses for teacher and staff – April and May

- Applies to both centers and homes, for staff working on site at the child care program.
- Paid directly to program
- Bonuses are subject to payroll taxes and made available to staff through program's payroll service
- Rates -
 - Full time \$300 per month for all teaching staff; \$200 per month for non-teaching staff
 - Part-time 20 hours or less, \$150 for teachers; \$100 non teaching staff



Comments from the Field – Child Care Providers

- Mix of Programs Open and Closed
- Most programs face significant vacancies
- Difficult balance between protecting health of staff, children and families versus staying open to serve essential workers
- Guaranteed subsidy payment is very helpful, but some still losing money to stay open
- Big hole is private pay parent fees some parents donating their fees
- Some able to continue salaries and benefits/others not able.
- Struggle to pay staff salaries and benefits some furloughing to staff so they can collect unemployment insurance which pays better.

"I feel like I'm at war right now, like I'm on the battlefield. Every day you're hoping you don't have a teacher who gets it, praying that you don't get it, that none of the children have it, and that the parents understand all the new guidelines. I want to stand up and help my state and essential workers, but on the other hand, what is the incentive for me to continue to risk my life and my staff's life every day?"
